S. P. & S. STEAM LOCOMOTIVES - By Miln Gillespie

Awaiting higher scrap prices are most of "The Northwest is Own Rail-way" steamers as follows: three 4-8-4 northerns, numbers 700, 701 and 702, built in 1938; simple-articulated mallets, numbers 901, 903, 904, and 905 (class Z-6), and number 911 (class Z-8), All consolidated type locomotives have already been cut up for scrap except number 539 which is being held for donation to the City of Vancouver, Wn., pending selection of a permanent preservation site. Given another year's lease on life as protection for high water or other emergencies are simple mallets numbers 900 and 902 (Z-6), and number 910 (Z-8).
