REPORTING MARKS & A.C.I. FOR CAR 598

The A.A.R. has assigned the reporting marks "PNWC" to the Pacific Northwest Chapter for use on observation car 598. Application for reporting marks was made necessary by the requirement for Automatic Car Identification labels on all railroad equipment by January 1, 1970.

For A.C.I. purposes the mark "PNWC" has been assigned the numerical designation 925. For car 598 it will be preceded by a "7" which indicates passenger equipment in the A.C.I. system. In numerical terms the label for car 598 will read: 7 925 000598.

Each A.C.I. label consists of thirteen "lines" or, more correctly, label modules. Labels begin with a "start" module and end with "stop" and "validity check digit" modules. The complete label for car 598 willtherefore be arranged as follows: "start", 7 925 000598, "stop", "validity check digit".

By way of background, Automatic Car Identification was adopted by the railroads as a means of rapidly and accurately reported car movements to their computerized information systems. In addition to the Sylvania "KarTrak" system which is coming into use, systems by Abex and Wabco were considered. According to the AAR evaluation study the Wabco system was turned down due to possible danger to personnel from its laser scanner. The Abex system was discounted because of expensive labels requiring very critical placement on car sides.

According to the Wall Street Journal, four railroads owned or controlled by Southern will be consolidated into one unit to be called Central of Georgia Railroad.

Central of Georgia Railway will be largest of the four lines to join the new corporation. The other lines also losing corporate identity are: Wrightville & Tennille RR, Georgia & Florida Rly, and the Savannah & Atlanta Railway.

In the years past, large meetings in the United States usually prompted the accumulation of a large number of Pullman cars at the event. In the second week of July, 1969 the last "roundup" so to speak of Pullman cars occured in the Spokane, Washington area as thousands of Boy Scouts converged on Farraget, Idaho for their national convention. The Pullman Company was at this time being dissolved but the action was put off until the Boy Scout function was over. from the "Wall Street Journal", 21 October 1969:

MORRISON-KNUDSEN UNIT PURCHASES HALF INTEREST IN CANADIAN COAL VENTURE

Boise, Idaho - Morrison-Knudsen Inc. said a subsidiary has purchased a 50% interest in "extensive" coal properties in the Elk River Valley area of southeastern British Columbia from Scurry-Rainbow Oil Ltd., Calgary.

The properties, which the Idaho construction and engineering concern says contains deposits of high-grade coaking coal estimated "in excess of 100 million tons," will be mined by open-cut methods by a jointly owned operating company of Morrison-Knudsen and Scurry-Rainbow.

The coal, which will be transported by unit train to Roberts Bank, a port near Vancouver, will be marketed principally in Japan, Morrison-Knudsen said. Mining operations are expected to begin "late in 1971" and first deliveries should begin in "early 1972," it said.

The operation will mark the first time Morrison-Knudsen has operated such a mining venture, although the company often has acted as an operator for other concerns.

Editors note: Does this explain several of the ALCO 636 demo units bearing Morrison-Knudsen logo?
